Your Guide to Medications and Breastfeeding





You may have questions or concerns about how medications you are taking can affect your breast milk and your baby.

Research shows that the benefits of breastfeeding outweigh the risks of not breastfeeding for patients who take most over the counter or prescription drugs and vaccines as recommended. Therefore, most patients do not need to interrupt breastfeeding when taking a drug or when receiving a vaccine.
